News from the Park Administrator

As March ends and April begins, the temps are getting hotter and the humidity is getting stickier. We had fog in Light and Life Park when I arrived this morning before sunrise. As announcements go out, events are being described as the last of the season. Members who have homes up north are preparing for the trip. As you get ready to leave, don't forget to stop by the office to say "Goodbye."

We remain very busy in the office. There are requests for lodging for next season being dropped off. New membership applications are arriving daily, it seems. Title work continues for those who have committed to rebuilding damaged units.

I am looking forward to the summer. This is when I get a chance to catch up from the previous season and then prepare for the next. I have more catching up to do this year than in years past.

Make sure you contact the post office two weeks prior to leaving to have your mail forwarded.

Now for the instructions I don't want to write, and you don't want to read. However, we must be prepared for the next hurricane season.

As you prepare to head home for the summer season, make sure you have moved everything from your open car port, porch or patio and place it inside. Do not leave anything outside that could be picked up by wind or water. If you leave something outside like a chair, couch, table, lawn ornaments, planters or other items, they may be moved to a dumpster. The park employees will not put your items inside your home. That is not our responsibility. It is your responsibility to do it before you leave. If you have a travel trailer that is not tied down, make sure it is ready to be moved. If you have replaced the doors to your home and the locks have been changed, please make sure the office gets a new key. Do not leave your personal property (golf carts, cars, building materials, furniture, etc.) on other people's lot unless you have expressed permission from the lot owner. Do not leave anything on an open lot unless you have permission from the park office.

Most importantly, have a safe and healthy summer. Those of us who are here year-round will do our best to make sure the park will be here when you get back. We will also enjoy the peace and solitude of the park during the slow summer months.


Dinner at the Max Fridays 5:30 pm
