News from the Park Administrator

It's August! Last month, Gloria and I had the privilege of having all four of our grandchildren visit the park at the same time along with our younger son, Frank. This is the first time the four grandchildren have been together for many years! It was important to us for them to become better acquainted. They seemed to enjoy each other, and we had a great time with them. We visited the Safari Ranch in Lakeland, played miniature golf and table tennis, and played some table games. Most importantly, we spent time with them.

As we move further into the hurricane season, I want to remind everyone of some important points.

- It is vital that we know everyone who is in the Park. In the event of severe weather and possible life-threatening damage, we must know who we need to account for.
- If you are in the Park when a hurricane watch or warning is issued, you must ensure that all outdoor articles are secure—either tie them down or put them indoors.
- Although a hurricane is not in the forecast as I write this, it is important that you prepare yourself and your family. Visit https://www.hillsboroughcounty.org/en/residents/publicsafety/emergency-management/hurricane-and-tropicalstorm-preparedness to review how you need to prepare for a storm.

There are several projects that are in progress **but** I need help so they can be completed.

- 1) Conduit needs to be run from the back of my house to the gate.
- 2) Two cameras need to be placed for surveillance at the gate. We currently can see everyone coming and leaving, but we want to have a better view of them at the call box.

3) The audio/video booth at Hood Hall is coming along well, but some additional wires need to be run, and audio jacks need to be connected. If you can assist with any of these, please let me know so we can move toward completion.

The Ebenezer/Zion water project has been completed. However, if you need assistance when you return with the location of shut off valves or are having trouble getting water, please let us know.

The Board and I continue to work on the property purchases. I don't have any updates currently. When I have an important update, I will let you know.

We had several trees trimmed this month and two were removed. The two trees by the wastewater treatment plant that were causing interruptions in the normal operation of the plant were cut down. Some low-lying and dead branches above some residences were trimmed, and the tree across from the office was given a trim.

On the resident's information form that was updated a couple of years ago, we asked for vehicle information. Although it is not required, we started asking for that information because of a situation that took place early in the Covid pandemic. A resident was missing and no one, not even the family, knew the make, model, or license plate of that individual's car. A silver alert should have been issued, but we could not do so because we didn't have that information. Please update your vehicle(s) information by sending an email to the office (office@lightandlifepark.org).

If you have changed the locks on your residence, please provide a copy of the key(s) to the office per Rule 3.1(h). Also, be aware that we will not give a key to anyone other than the owner without specific instructions from the owner informing us who can be given the key.

I hope you all have the chance to visit and spend time with your family this summer as I have. I know that doing things together leaves lasting impressions. Enjoy your ongoing summer!

The Work Goes on

News from the Board of Directors

Our roots are deep here at Light and Life Park. Many years ago, Leaders had a vision to begin what was to be called Light and Life Camp. The following are excerpts from "A HISTORICAL RECORD OF FLORIDA LIGHT AND LIFE CAMP By DONALD J. CLEVELAND Published April 1995". The entire article can be found on the Park website.

"The Florida Conference of the Free Methodist Church of North America came into being in 1951 when the Georgia-Florida Conference voted to become two separate conferences.

The Florida Conference campground was located at Kissimmee from 1938 until 1958 when the property was sold. At the annual conference of 1964 a decision was made to search for a site for a new campground. Pastor Gordon Smith of Lakeland, First and Florida Conference Superintendent Elmer Hood located a forty-acre site at the west end of Deeson Road in Hillsborough County. In February 1965, the conference "Camp Meeting Committee" met at Lakeland, First Church and considered a proposal for purchase of the property. The decision was made to recommend to the annual conference to purchase the property at a cost of \$30,000.

A Camp Development Committee was formed and soon work was begun."

Light and Life Camp was born. Youth camp, family camp and annual conference were held at the campground in the summer of 1966. The next few years campers stayed in tents, travel trailers and the few cottages that had been constructed followed by the start of leasing property which had been subdivided.

The Camp continued to grow over the years with a dining hall, motel, a few houses and travel trailer park, soft ball field, shuffleboard, and swimming pool.

More land was purchased: "a ten-acre acquisition to the property on the east boundary of the original forty acres. In the mid-1970's this was purchased along with twenty acres along the south boundary."

Then into the late 1970s early 1980s: "This new property, consisting of forty-three acres across the south boundary and running east fifty feet beyond the Polk County line, in 1982. The cost was \$125,000."

We all owe a big thank you to those leaders many years ago that had the foresight to begin what we all enjoy here at Light and Life Park. As a longtime resident recently stated: "I don't believe we have ever regretted purchasing land"

The Crystal Cavern by Hannah Alexander

Those who love mystery stories will be drawn into *The Crystal Cavern* from the very first page. Dr. Sable Chamberlin recently finished her Residency and has been practicing as the physician for Boswell Mining, in Missouri, including low wages and long hours. Her grandfather was recently murdered, and she is next on the hit list!

When an ice storm strands Sable Chamberlin and Paul Murphy in the southern Missouri hills, they assume they're safe from the mysterious killer responsible for murdering Sable's grandfather and Paul's uncle. But while searching Sable's childhood home and connecting caves for clues, it becomes clear that real danger has followed them.

A Nickel's Worth of Skim Milk: A Boy's View of the Great Depression

by Robert J. Hastings

The Great Depression was an era when there was very little to be had. We, today, cannot imagine how restricted it was for a family to have very little supplies, including food. This book brings that time to a realistic image at what every-day life was like in 1929 and the early 30's.

One reviewer's words explains it clearly: "I would recommend this for anyone who wants to know what life was like for the people who lived through the Great Depression. It is a wonderful look into the life of one boy and his family. It is the kind of book that every student should read when studying the Great Depression. Textbooks will tell you what happened, but they never really give you a good idea of what life was like for the people who were affected. This book does. As the author points out on the jacket, when the book was published in 1972, people started writing about him and saying he was "writing about my family, as much as your own." A book really worth the read."
