News from the Park Administrator

Wow, it's August. The weather here has returned to a more normal heavy late afternoon rains and mild, sunny mornings, but it is still quite humid. We've had several large downpours so that the pond and the Jordan have returned from the brink of dryness. In fact, over the last few weeks the levels for each have risen several feet.

Progress has been slow at our continued cleanup of 5580 Deeson Rd. Many more immediate situations have arisen that needed attention. Really, we're just saving the work for you all when you return. Actually, as staff and volunteers have time and are willing to work in the hot, muggy air, they put some time in. We are still picking up pavers, cement blocks, and coral rock. It is difficult for me to understand why there were so many.

Recently, we collected water samples for testing the levels of many different chemicals and pollutants. This is done every three years unless there have been any exceedances. Once again, none of the elements that are checked exceeded the minimum acceptable levels. Samples were also collected from ten (10) residences for testing that is done every year. So far, those results have not been received. When they are, I will let you know.

If you do not have someone taking care of the trimming around your residence, you MUST make those arrangements now. The green stuff (you know, grass and weeds) is growing at several inches **a week**. I will be sending out notices soon to anyone whose residence has not been cared for.

Please be in prayer for the staff this summer. There have been many important interruptions that have kept us from working on larger projects that have deadlines looming ahead. Your prayers for God holding back interruptions are coveted.

Stamps for Missions

Actual stamps and computer-generated postage (with an illustration, photograph, or mosaic) and preprinted stamp pictures on envelopes are acceptable BUT no information printed on paper, no metered mail nor permit number of businesses and organizations.

I know it gets confusing, when in doubt save it. Doing so supports Spanish Christian literature efforts; we're working towards our goal of \$2 million raised.

Blood Pressure


Since many people are heading north for the summer, the blood pressure clinics have come to an end.

Book Review

Hillbilly Elegy A Memoir of a Family and Culture in Crisis

by J. D. Vance (President Trump's Running Mate)

We want to know about J. D. Vance, Trump's running mate for Vice President under the Republican ticket. As a Christian we want people who have accepted Christ as their savior leading our country. We are all unsure of who Mr. Vance is, so when asked if we could find books about this person, I eagerly looked up information.

J. D. Vance is a U. S. Senator from Ohio, who was in the Marines and is a graduate from Yale University School of Law. He is from a "Rust Belt" town, an area. Continued from previous column.

of the United States which has experienced a significant decline in the economy, which comes with loss of higher income jobs therefore increased poverty rates. It reminds me of the Oil City, PA area after Quaker State moved its headquarters to Texas.

From the information provided: There are so many areas of the U. S. which can be included in the Rust Belt stigma. This book seems to show significance of this type of problem facing many Americans today.

The Vance family story begins in postwar America. J. D.'s grandparents were "dirt poor and in love," and moved north from Kentucky's Appalachia region to Ohio in the hopes of escaping the dreadful poverty around them. They raised a middle-class family, and eventually their grandchild (the author) would graduate from Yale Law School, a conventional marker of their success in achieving generational upward mobility.

But as the family saga of *Hillbilly Elegy* plays out, we learn that this is only the short, superficial version. Vance's grandparents, aunt, uncle, sister, and, most of all, his mother, struggled profoundly with the demands of their new middle-class life, and were never able to fully escape the legacy of abuse, alcoholism, poverty, and trauma so characteristic of their part of America. Vance piercingly shows how he himself still carries around the demons of their chaotic family history.

A deeply moving memoir with its share of humor and vividly colorful figures, *Hillbilly Elegy* is the story of how upward mobility really feels. And it is an urgent and troubling meditation on the loss of the American dream for a large segment of this country.

This book is coming to our library within the next week. It will be in the new section of the library as soon as I process it. It will offer you some insight into the Republican nomination for Vice President.

Why Politics and Religion Don't Make for Nice Company" From The Wake Up Call Daily Devotional by J.D. Walt

Then Paul, knowing that some of them were Sadducees and the others Pharisees, called out in the Sanhedrin, "My brothers, I am a Pharisee, descended from Pharisees. I stand on trial because of the hope of the resurrection of the dead." When he said this, a dispute broke out between the Pharisees and the Sadducees, and the assembly was divided. (The Sadducees say that there is no resurrection, and that there are neither angels nor spirits, but the Pharisees believe all these things.)

There was a great uproar, and some of the teachers of the law who were Pharisees stood up and argued vigorously. "We find nothing wrong with this man," they said. "What if a spirit or an angel has spoken to him?" The dispute became so violent that the commander was afraid Paul would be torn to pieces by them. He ordered the troops to go down and take him away from them by force and bring him into the barracks.

The following night the Lord stood near Paul and said, "Take courage! As you have testified about me in Jerusalem, so you must also testify in Rome." Acts 23:6–11 (NIV)

CONSIDER THIS: On the one hand, it looks like Paul pulled a trick play right out of the playbook of Sun Tzu. A common enemy produces allies, but if the allies can be turned against one another the focus on the common enemy is lost. And if the alliance can be broken by appealing to a deeper bond between the common enemy and one of the allies, all the better. You've heard the saying, "My enemy's enemy is my friend." Paul, as a Pharisee, knew the Pharisees believed in the Resurrection of the dead and that the Sadducees

did not believe it and further that it was a point of bitter dispute.

Though it's not a great analogy, Paul knew Sadducees and Pharisees were something akin to the Democrats and the Republicans today. They weren't so much political parties as they were theological parties. In my estimation, they weren't so much theological parties as they were ideological factions. Whenever an ideologically partisan faction masquerades as a theological movement it quickly gets political, and people get murdered in the name of "God." (It's a much larger and more nuanced conversation but this is the essence of Christian nationalism.)

You've heard the saying, "Politics makes strange bedfellows"? That's what we see here. Some of the leaders of the Pharisees, the ones trying to kill Paul, actually took Paul's defense. In the end, though, it didn't work. Rather than getting the attention off from himself, Paul had to be forcibly removed by the soldiers to keep him from being literally torn to pieces. He became the proverbial rope in their game of ideological tug of war.

This is our first sign that the conflict is far more ideological than theological in nature. Do you remember the day when avowed enemies, Herod and Pilate, shook hands in a common alliance against Jesus? That's the problem with so many religious disputes. They are often just power battles clothed in theological garb. When theology devolves into ideology it's a short step to idolatry (manipulation and control) which inevitably

pushes out doxology (surrender and worship). The power of the gospel, by its very nature as the power of God, threatened to undermine and undo the power of the Pharisees and the Sadducees.

I think there's a word tucked in here for Christians in an embattled and embittered election year. Religion and politics don't make for nice company. However, worship and prayer make for "good" church.

This kind of thing continues to happen in the church among the people of God to this very day because we choose to stay at the level of religion and politics. In our efforts to fight what we consider to be false ideologies with what we believe to be good theology, we usually wind up becoming counter-ideologues ourselves and the whole thing becomes about power and winning. We tend to slaughter our opponents not so much with weaponry as with our words; and yes, it still happens in the name of "God."

Unless our theology becomes doxology it is really only veiled ideology that turns to idolatry (i.e., control).

So how does theology become doxology? Thanks for asking.

Get down on your knees. Declare aloud, "Jesus is Lord."

By way of qualification let me say this: The gospel is political though Jesus is not a partisan. And the kingdom of heaven does mean societal reformation (though we should be wary of social engineering). And certainly, a democratic constitutional republic is worlds different from an ancient imperialistic empire.

In the midst of all this complexity, the real worship of God under the lordship of Jesus Christ matters most. Despite all our differences in this society and across the world, we must labor to find each other underneath the banner of the cross in true humility and self-giving love.

Only here might we bury our broken politics and behold the resurrection of genuine political engagement. This is what the church is. This is what a great awakening looks like.
