News from the Park Administrator

We have a full month in 2024 under our belt already. As I reflect on the first month, I observe two realities.

- 1) It seems that there are more activities to choose from than in the past. This offers activities to people who may not have been interested in other choices in the past. It also may mean you will have to choose between two different but equally appealing activities.
- 2) There are a lot of new people here! Make sure you introduce yourselves and help them feel at home.

Welcome to all the new faces this year! I'm sure you have many questions, and we have good news. Bob Ferguson is beginning "onboarding" sessions titled, *Life at the Park*. The purpose of the sessions is to provide information that we know new members often ask as well as to answer other questions they may have. The schedule has not been finalized, so watch your email for notifications.

It appears that we are close to purchasing the property at 5580 Deeson Road. The final piece of paperwork that the owner needed to file has been filed. Now we are waiting for the residents to vacate the property. I will keep you informed as I learn more.

Many of you may not know, but this past summer a part of the ceiling in the ice machine room fell. Thanks to Mel Stevenson, the ceiling has been replaced. While he was working on that, he realized the exterior door was not opening easily and that the frame was rotting. This led to the door being replaced, which Mel also completed. Although the door is primed, it will need a coat of exterior paint to match the rest of the building. Any volunteers?

I know the gate is a concern for many of you. Our technician seemed not to know why the gate was malfunctioning. However, there are several in the Park who continue to troubleshoot, diagnose, and work to make the necessary repairs. Please know that this is a priority. We have not been ignoring it!

As I have mentioned in the past, we will be inventorying water lines during this season and into the summer. As we do this, staff and volunteers will be uncovering your shutoff valves to identify what kinds of pipe are on either side of the shutoff. They will also be taking pictures and collecting other information to satisfy the requirements. If you have any questions about this process, please let me know. We discovered early last year that there is some confusion about the boundaries of the eight acres that we own across from the office. We have contacted a surveyor to survey the property and provide markers. This will help us install fencing on the north and east sides of the property. This will provide a visual marker for people in Blackwater that there is a boundary. Hopefully, this will stop the four-wheeling that has taken place in the past.

We are working to replace the tables and chairs in Hood Hall. Several tables and chairs have been donated, but we still need 172 chairs and 17 tables. I estimate that the cost for the remaining need is around \$6,000. If you want to donate to this fund, you can drop off a check or cash at the office and specify that it is for the tables and chairs in Hood Hall. Flo Grabowski is going to contact the manager of Sams Club to see if she can negotiate a deal to reduce the cost.

It's great to see so many things happening and so many new faces. I pray you have an enjoyable season during which you receive spiritual, emotional, and mental refreshment.

News from the Board of Directors

Another month has flown by and it's February already. The winter season has begun here at Light and Life Park. We held our first BOD meeting on Jan 8 and our first residents meeting of the year on January 15th. We are in full swing! There were 183 resident members in attendance at Hood Hall and 21 members online via Zoom. It was great to see all your smiling faces.

Here are some of the highlights from those meetings:

Finance: Expenses have been up but so has our income, resulting in a budget surplus to help cover our aging infrastructure. We are still seeking pledges for active projects. Contact the office for more details. Another option is to consider is the endowment fund through the Free Methodist Church.

Nominating Committee: They have met and are preparing to seek nominations for the BOD and the committee positions that need to be filled and voted on by the Park membership.

Building and Grounds: will be seeking another option for adding a wheelchair accessible room at the RV bathhouse as well as upgrades for storm drains and water lines. They are also in the process of mapping all water lines as well as updating some equipment and purchasing new. This is the infrastructure that we must pay close attention to and keep maintaining. A tribute was given to Mike Lower for his many years of service in our Park. Volunteers will again be called on to help with these projects.

We expect many of the committees will meet soon and reports will follow. Committees can be the life blood of our community. You do not need to be a board member to serve on some of the committees. If you are interested in serving in any way, contact one of your BOD members.

Things to come: The Finance committee will be meeting soon to review the capital projects for 2024. When the property purchase at 5580 Deeson is completed, we will begin the cleanup. As a reminder, "**Safety**" is our number one concern when the work begins.

Something else in the planning stages is a "new member orientation". This would be a scheduled meeting for all **new** residents, to answer any questions you might have concerning the "Do's and Don'ts "of the Park.

It is becoming very busy in our Park with all the activities going on. The CALENDER IS VERY FULL. So full, that is hard to find openings for anything. What we really need is an **Activities Director**God Bless

Stamps for Missions

All donated stamps are sent to Alliance Stamp Ministry in Fort Myers where they are sold to dealers. The money is sent to a publisher in Buenos Aires, Argentina where they publish Sunday school material in Spanish that are sold to at least eight Latin American Countries as well as Spain and the They are used by over 40 Protestant Denominations.

We recently received some postage stamps that had been in a family's possession for many, many years, even a postcard with the stamp still attached. When you downsize, move, clean out a residence when settling an estate, etc. remember to **BE ON THE LOOKOUT** for postage stamps, new or old, domestic, or foreign, and postcards with without stamps.

Leave at least a 1/4" border on ALL sides. Get into the habit of opening either the left or bottom side of envelopes to protect the stamps and that border as they then increase greatly in value. The mission programs that benefit from the sale of these stamps will be grateful.

If you already have or find stamps without the recommended 1/4" border and/or with no paper backing, please turn them in at Hood Hall also; they'll be appreciated, just won't generate as much income for missions' projects.

There's no harm in asking your children and grandchildren to save the stamped envelopes for

you when you mail their

In This Moment by Gabrielle Meyer

When I chose, In This Moment, time-travel intrigued me. Thinking about parallel universes is hard to imagine. In this book Maggie has inherited a gift of crossing time in three eras. One is during the Civil War, in 1861, another during World War II in 1941, and one during 2001.

She has three separate lives, not knowing which timeperiod she will wake up in. When she turns 21, Maggie must decide which one she will choose to live out her days in.

The author, Gabrielle Meyer has done a spectacular job of writing in three different time periods, making you feel as if you are in each one. Three different plots, yet such similarities. When you get to the end, you will be surprised at her decision.

A Note from our Pastor

In March of 2015, my mother passed away unexpectedly here in Zephyrhills Florida causing me to have to take three weeks off from my position as pastor at The Gowanda FMC. I had to handle the details of her funeral and burial, run an estate sale, begin the process of executing her will, and preparing her house for sale, that she and my dad spent the last 33 years of their lives in. It was a big job, and it was a very emotional job, selling all the familiar things that were in our home I grew up in. I know several of you have had to walk this same path, through this difficult season when your parents passed. Many of you have had to do this very thing and you can relate to how emotionally trying it is.

This all happened in March and if you're from the north you know how inhospitable March can be. When I finally arrived home, I was expecting a mess. I expected a driveway full of snow, unshoveled walks, and everything else that would happen while leaving your house unattended for three weeks during a western New York winter. But when I arrived home, I was shocked. The driveway was scraped down to the blacktop. The sidewalks were shoveled and salted. I walked to my front door and pushed in, pulling my suitcase behind me. Immediately the smell of beef stew wafted from the kitchen. What is this, I thought to myself? I walked into the kitchen to find a crockpot full of beef stew on the counter along with a loaf of fresh baked bread. The refrigerator was cleaned out and all my perishables had been replaced. Fresh vegetables,

milk, fruit, it was all there. The house had been cleaned and smelled fresh. And an apple pie wrapped in cellophane with a smiley face drawn on top with a sharpie marker also sat atop the counter.

In that moment when I realized that this was the work of the people of my church I was so deeply touched. I had never felt more loved than I did at that moment. That act of kindness and compassion made such a huge impact on me.

Nobody claimed the credit for this act of kindness. I still don't know to this day who pulled off this generous act of love. They even covered their tracks by making the beef stew in my crockpot so it wouldn't have to be returned. When I asked my church leadership who they thought might have done this... They said, probably someone who loves God and loves you too. =)

On Sunday January 7th I got a call from my son who was in the hospital in Erie PA, with a severe Bacterial infection in the bones of his back. He had already had emergency surgery to open his back and clean out an abscess that had formed on his spine. I could tell by his voice that he wasn't ok and that he was scared.

The timing couldn't have been worse for me. Bible conference kicked off that very day and the thought of getting to step away seemed unlikely due to everything that needed to happen. But when I shared what was happening with the leadership team here at the church the response was immediate. "Go! You need to be with your son."

With your permission and grace, I bought my tickets, and I was standing in my son's hospital room by early Monday morning. God did some wonderful physical healing as well as miraculous spiritual healing during that time. Thank you for affording me the opportunity to go.

When I returned home to Light and Life, I was told that not only was grace given by allowing me to step out during the busiest time of the year, but that several people had contributed toward helping to cover the

cost of my trip north. I am humbled. Again, I was deeply blessed. Again, I felt loved by my church family.

I want to express my deepest gratitude to all of you who said go, to all of you who blessed me through giving toward the cost, and to all of you who prayed for my sons healing. You accomplished more than you can imagine. God took your prayers and performed miracles.

I love you all. Thank you for pouring out your love so generously.
