News from the Park Administrator

Hello from the park office. It is hard to believe the winter season is two thirds over. While some things have returned to normal, most of the park is still trying to rebuild and establish a new normal. I want to thank the Bucket Listers for resuming their usual events such as Trivia Night and Movie Night. This has brought back some normalcy to the park and given the residents a time to enjoy each other and forget about the work still to be done.

During the month of February, the board approved at least seven new parties to purchase or lease at the park. I have received commitments from people to rebuild nine trailers that were damaged in the flood. There are just three or four trailers waiting to be rebuilt. There are three damaged homes still on the market to be sold.

This is a long ways from where we were just a month or two ago. At one point I had over 12 places waiting to be rebuilt and five places on the market to be sold.

On Monday 2/24/25, Phil Allen started as the new Office Manager. It will take some time for me to get him up to speed. But that is not his fault, it is mine. I am so busy it is hard to get time to train him. I have total confidence that Phil will catch on quickly and do a great job.

We continue getting the travel trailers situated throughout the park. We are still assigning them to people who need a place to stay while they rebuild their place. I may soon be at a place where the park will be able to rent trailers to visiting family members.

Stamps for Missions

We continue to collect foreign and domestic postage stamps, new or canceled, which are then sent to Alliance Stamp Ministry who in turn sell them to stamp collectors. Profits are used to produce Sunday School materials in Spanish to be used here and abroad. Please carefully trim a 1/4 to 1/3-inch border on all sides then take them to Hood Hall where a box is located near the mailboxes by the NW door. When stamps are adjacent or in a strip cut around the grouping not between individual stamps. IF some are given to you which have been damaged, torn or cut too closely we can still use them, they just don't generate as much revenue. Do not attempt to remove stamps from the paper envelope/packaging by wetting/soaking them. Foreign stamps are more profitable if as much of the postmark as possible is still there. We also collect new/used postcards for the same purpose: leave stamps attached.

Your efforts are greatly appreciated and they matter to little Spanish readers!




At Tell Your Story on February 13, 2025, Banana Splits were scooped up. What an overwhelming response we had. Thank you for your support and patience!
