News from the Park Administrator

When I stepped outside this morning, I thought it was chilly at 55°. Then, someone who just arrived from Michigan said they experienced snow last week. No snow here! And for that, I am thankful. Blue skies and 66° now with an expected high of 81°.

Have you seen the baby goats yet? It is so much fun watching them jump and run. Please note that you are not to feed the goats when they are in the little barn/shed. Both the nanny and the kids have special dietary needs right now, and our feeding them can make them sick.

By the time you read this, the initial cleanup done by an outside contractor will be complete. But there is still much to do. We need to remove the concrete that was left at our instruction. The grounds will need to be raked, and the leaves disposed of. There are many pavers that will need to be removed and stored for other use. The property will be treated for fleas and fire ants. It will need to be mowed. Now that the first stage of the cleanup is completed, I encourage you to continue in prayer about how we are going to use the property.

If you leave a car in the Park when you go home for the summer, you are not to park the vehicle in someone else's driveway without the permission of the owner. You should park the vehicle either on your lot or across the Jordon. If you choose to park the vehicle across the Jordon, please check with me about the proper location.

The hurricane season starts in only one month. Are you ready? If you are a summer resident, remember that you need to have a "to go" bag, plenty of water, and a supply of foods that do not require refrigeration. You should start building up your supply now. Your neighbors who have left for the summer should have secured all their yard items. However, if you see something they have left outdoors that might become windblown, please check with the neighbor to find out what they would like done with the items.

When the Park experiences severe weather, it is important that the office knows who is—and who isn't—in the Park.

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Should the severe weather cause extensive damage, we need to verify that everyone is accounted for and that everyone who needs help receives it. That cannot be done if we are not aware of a person's presence. So, please let us know if you are visiting or leaving the Park for an extended time.

Once again, I remind you that members are responsible for trimming around their residence in the Park even while you are not here. If you have not already arranged for someone to do that trimming, please do so as soon as possible. Once the rain starts, everything grows very quickly. Many people I've talked to in the past are surprised with the height of the weeds and grass when left unattended for a short time. Please do not ignore planning for your trimming.

I don't want to be overly optimistic, but the gate has been operational since the most recent visit by the contractor. Like many of you, I hope it continues to work as expected for the foreseeable future.

We still have a resident alligator in our pond. Remember, do not feed or torment it. Those actions can cause the alligator to become aggressive. Just enjoy watching it from a distance.

While those of you who have gone north are enjoying the cool temperatures, I will be enjoying the heat as it ramps up. Have a great summer. May you know God's presence and blessing.



What a beautiful drive to our northern home from our winter home. Spring is in bloom in the mountains of West Virginia.... dogwood, red bud and another lavender blossom tree (maybe Wisteria?). Yes, a different drive for us as we stopped in Hilton Head Island for a couple of days.

Another season comes to a close at Light and Life Park as our last BOD was on April 8. We have scheduled Board meetings via Zoom for June 3, August 5, and October 7. These meetings will allow us to continue to do any business necessary during the summer and keep us apprised of Park operations.

In our last BOD meeting we approved the following projects: install lighting along the sidewalk from Library to Shiloh path (a suggestion from the Bucket listers), approval to purchase some sort of heavy equipment (such as a bulldozer) to do work around the Park. This could be very useful for our new property 5580 Deeson. We also approved a "mini golf" fundraiser.

It was a very busy year. The Jordan "outfall" storm drain is nearing completion, clean up on our latest property is nearing completion, and many other projects with the help of our volunteers.

With the property at 5580 Deeson nearing completion and the residence at 5570 Deeson being vacant, we have had many discussions with <u>Future Planning</u> and <u>Building and Grounds</u> as to what is next for these areas. We will be investigating with the county as to possible changes of zoning requirements for these areas.

The updated Rules and Regulations were approved and will be available on the park website and in printed form. The Bylaws committee presented changes and were approved. They will be presented to the membership in the January members' meeting.

We are currently waiting for the building permit from Hillsborough County so our construction company can begin the work on the shade structure at the pool.



Library Notes

Just a reminder that:

- Books may be taken out for one month.
- DVDs for only two weeks.
- Do not take books from the Returned Book Drawer as they have not been processed to be returned to the shelf.
- Always sign the card in the back of the book and place it in the basket for the cards,
- Enter the date (one month from the day you signed it out) on the yellow slip.
- People are returning books, and we can't find the card in the file box. This tends to be when the books are taken from the Return Box, or the person did not sign it out and took the card with them.
- Many people this year are positive they returned their books, but they are not in the library. There are many reasons.
- Do not give the book to someone else to read as this leaves you with the responsibility to pay for the lost book.
- This Librarian does make mistakes, but these are real issues to be addressed. Thank you!

Book Review

June Bug by Chris Fabry

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It is easy to by-pass older books in the library but often people will let me know about a book they have recently read. Such is the case with *June Bug*. Chris Fabry is an excellent writer who has written well-read books such as War Room and a *Piece of the Moon* (we have this one in the library).

The book is narrated mostly through the eyes of a nine-year-old, June Bug. She and her father traveled the United States in an old broken-down RV, spending many nights in Wal Mart parking lots "for as long as she can remember.".

June Bug believed everything her daddy told her until she walked into Wal-Mart and saw her picture on a little poster. One morning, she walks past the greeter at the front of the store, her eyes are drawn to the pictures of missing children, where she sees a picture of herself. This discovery begins a journey for the truth about her father, the mother he rarely speaks about, and herself. When her father's past catches up with them, they are drawn to Dogwood, West Virginia, down a winding path that will change their lives forever. Thus, begins a series of long journeys-physical, emotional, and spiritual--for both father and daughter as both try to sort out the puzzle of their past and build a future.

The author slowly peels the layers away, revealing the story of how and why one little girl disappeared, her father's history, and all about her family. Chris Fabry interweaves enough plot twists and tension to keep readers turning the pages. How he ends the story is as important as how he introduced it. It is well worth the read! You can find it in the fiction section by author.

A Note from our Pastor

¹⁴ So the people left their camp to cross the Jordan, and the priests who were carrying the Ark of the Covenant went ahead of them. ¹⁵ It was the harvest season, and the Jordan was overflowing its banks. But as soon as the feet of the priests who were carrying the Ark touched the water at the river's edge, 16 the water above that point began backing up a great distance away at a town called Adam, which is near Zarethan. And the water below that point flowed on to the Dead Sea [c] until the riverbed was dry. Then all the people crossed over near the town of Jericho. ¹⁷ Meanwhile, the priests who were carrying the Ark of the LORD's Covenant stood on dry ground in the middle of the riverbed as the people passed by. They waited there until the whole nation of Israel had crossed the Jordan on dry ground." - Joshua 3:14-17

Do you ever need an answer to prayer? A serious need for an answer to prayer? A need that only God can provide, and you're not really sure how God Himself can answer your prayer?

God's people were freed from their slavery in Egypt. They had wandered for forty years around and around the wilderness. Finally...it is time to enter the land promised to them by God Himself.

But if this was in answer to their prayers, if they are entering a land God promised them, then why are things so difficult? Between them and the Promised Land is a raging river flooding over its banks.
