News from the Park Administrator

Believe it or not, it has been very dry here. Although we are in a region that reports we are only 1.67" below average, I believe we are much more than that in the Park. The pond has dropped about a foot in the last few days and the Jordan has stopped flowing. Our farmer neighbor to the west, Joe, told me the other day that he has never seen it so dry. Recently there were five different tropical depressions in the Atlantic or Gulf. It is a good reminder that we are in the middle of hurricane season. Here are some important reminders. We must know who is in the Park. Let the office know when you arrive and when you leave. If you have visitors, tell them they must register at the office.

Make certain that all items around your residence are secure. Visit <u>www.ready.gov</u> for more valuable information. Be certain to have your "pick-up-and-go" bags ready.

The maintenance team has been working diligently to bring our woodchipper back into service. For some time, the chipper has been difficult to start. In the process of checking for the cause of that, the team discovered several issues that needed to be addressed. After they replace one last part, the machine should be ready to be put back in use.

Several different alligators have been roaming our Park. I've seen a five- footer, a three-footer, and one very large one in the last several days! For everyone's safety:

- Do not feed alligators.
- Do not throw food in the water.
- Do not walk close to the water's edge.
- Do not torment/tease alligators.
- Do not swim in the water.

News from the Board of Directors

Another property purchase for our Park will soon be added to our History Book. We will soon be completing the deal for 5580 Deeson Road right outside our gate.

Back in early 2022 Jessica, the owner, approached us and asked if we would be interested in purchasing. We, of course, said YES. A proposal was put together and presented to her. Second thoughts, on her part, put the deal on hold. Stan kept in touch with Jessica all along. Then in July of this year she came back to us and said she was ready to sell now.

Stan and Bob Cannon met with her to confirm her intentions. A committee from the BOD met with Stan to discuss a new proposal. And on July 31st the agreement was signed for \$125,000. Part of the agreement included us doing much of the cleanup.

Inspections and surveying will need to be completed. Our hope is we will take ownership by September 29th.

A significant amount of cleanup will need to be done. We expect our awesome "Park Volunteer Brigade" will be anxious to get into action.

The Building and Grounds Committee will be working closely with Stan to organize the cleanup. **Our number one concern of course is safety for all.** Stay tuned as more details will be available soon.

As a reminder a pledge form is available on the Park website for anyone wishing to donate to this and other projects.

Thank you all for your prayers of guidance and support in this process. And a big thank you to Stan Welton and Bob Cannon for negotiating the purchase. Soon we will be able to add some more land to Florida's Light and Life Park. Also, keep in prayer for the other property at the NW border of our park, for that is still a possibility.

Stamps for Missions

All donated stamps are sent to Alliance Stamp Ministry in Fort Myers where they are sold to dealers. The money is sent to a publisher in Buenos Aires, Argentina where they publish Sunday school material in Spanish that are sold to at least eight Latin American Countries as well as Spain and the US. They are used by over 40 Protestant Denominations.

Try to leave at least 1/4 inch or more around each stamp or strip of stamps. They now collect picture post cards both unused and used. If used, please leave the stamps on the cards. Thank you. The container is in **Hood Hall** for your convenience.

Now take two sets of identical twins with the very same traits as those described above, meeting each other, falling in love, almost at first sight; both sets are Amish. That is the theme of Kathleen Fuller's series, *An Amish Mail-Order Bride, A Double Dose of Love.*

Amanda and Darla live in an Amish community two hours away from Zeke and Zeb who live in Birch Creek. A newspaper ad prompts Darla King to travel to Birch Creek in search of a husband. Her identical twin, Amanda, promises their parents she'll convince Darla to come home. The sisters' close relationship is strained as Darla asserts her independence and Amanda grapples with regrets of her past and the longings of her own heart.

Zeke and Zeb aren't looking for romance. They have their hands full with a new horse farm, a halffinished ranch house, and a wild colt, thanks to Zeke's hasty business dealings. Now Zeb must contend with Zeke's bad decisions, hidden debts, and tendency to avoid responsibility, which threaten their good standing in the Birch Creek Amish community.

No one can possibly predict the outcome as all four come face-to-face with their highest hopes and deepest insecurities. You can find this book and the rest of the series in the fiction stacks.
