News from the Park Administrator

Thanksgiving has passed, and the celebration of Christ's birth is fast approaching. That means that the Park will be filling up soon. I am looking forward to seeing you all again. As you anticipate the time here, I encourage you to greet and make friends with the many new people we have in the Park. Don't let old patterns get in the way.

According to the weather.com, Hurricane Nicole was the first such storm to make landfall on the mainland U.S. in 37 years. Shortly after making landfall, it was downgraded to a tropical storm and proceeded northwest through the center of the state. It actually passed directly over the Park. We experienced minimal effects, however. There were periodic heavy gusts of wind that knocked down a few branches and some Spanish moss. There was about 4" of rainfall that did not cause any flooding in the Park. Although there were a couple of power blinks, remarkably, there was no loss of power.

We have great plans for the Sugar Creek Gang this year which has been reorganized. We have developed a two-person leadership model. Greg Thomas will act as the group facilitator by organizing meetings, communicating with the group, and seeking volunteers for the various projects. He will be working together with Tom LaBrie who will be the primary project manager. Tom will make certain we have the tools and materials we need and will direct the various projects to completion. If we determine that two projects can be running concurrently, another project manager will be assigned.

Once again, I must emphasize safety on the roadways. Since there will be many walkers and bikers for the next several months, everyone needs to exercise caution on the roadways. If you are walking, running, or bicycling, wear bright clothing and, if exercising at night, have some type of lighting that can be seen from both directions. Automobile drivers should yield to pedestrians and bicyclists, stop at stop signs, and slow down (the posted speed limit is 15 mph)! Let's keep everyone in the Park safe.

By now you should have received the invoices for the annual fee and property taxes (if you are not billed by the county directly)

Tax payments are due by December 15 and the annual fees are due by January 15. Please be sure to submit your payments on time. If you have not received an invoice, please let the office know right away.

The Park provides a large dumpster to be used for construction debris and large furniture. If you use the dumpster to dispose of those items, you are asked to donate toward the costs associated with it. To date, the Park has been billed almost \$6,000 for the dumpster in 2022. We have received donations totaling just \$1,350 making the net cost slightly over \$4,500. Understand that the dumpster is here as a convenience. Otherwise, you would need to hire your own dumpster or haul your large or construction debris away yourself. Please help with this expense that benefits only those who use it.

My desire as the Christmas season approaches is that we take the time to, not only celebrate, but really appreciate what Christ's birth means for everyone. Hopefully, that will motivate us to make the Good News known to those around us both in conversation and our actions.

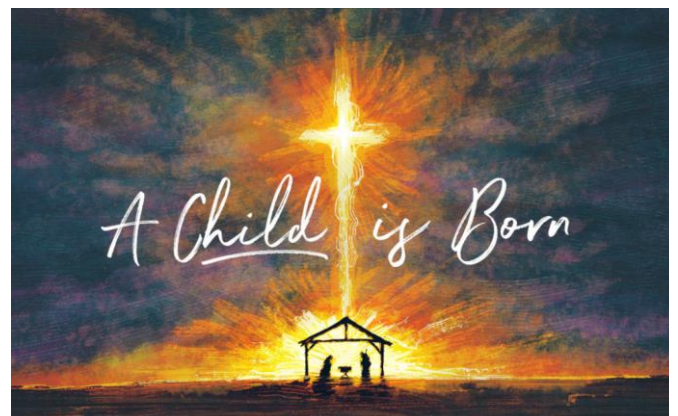

LOANED FROM: The New York Society Library in New York City

YEARS OVERDUE: 221

Five months into his first presidential term, George Washington borrowed this legal manifesto from the historic New York Society Library. For the next 221 years, it remained stowed away at his Virginia home, and organization officials wondered if they'd ever see it again. "We're not actively pursuing overdue fines," joked head librarian Mark Bartlett. "But we would be very happy to see the book returned." His wish was granted when Mount Vernon staff finally sent it back in 2010 (luckily, they dodged a whopping \$300,000 late fee).

The Mozart Code

by Rachel McMillan

The Mozart Code is full of suspense, spies, romance, along with twists and turns. If you like espionage, historical fiction, and another look at past wars and what they entail, this book is for you!

This short summary of the book says it all. Lady Sophia Huntington Villiers was a former spy. Her work with Alan Turing's Bombe Machines at Bletchley Park during the war attests to that. Now, as part of Simon Barre's covert team in post-war Vienna, she uses her charm and code name, *Starling*, to infiltrate the world of relics: uncovering vital information that could tilt the stakes of the mounting Cold War. When several influential men charge her with finding the death mask of Mozart, Sophie wonders if there is more than the composer's legacy at stake and finds herself drawn to potential answers in Prague.

Simon Barrington, the illegitimate heir of one of Sussex's oldest estates, used the previous war to hide his insecurities about his past.

Now, he uses his high breeding to gain access to all four allied quarters of the ruined city to slow the fall of the Iron Curtain. He has been in love with Sophie Villiers since the moment he met her. A marriage of convenience to save Simon's estate has always kept her close, until now, when Sophie's mysterious client in Prague forces him to wonder if her allegiance to him—and their cause—is in question. Torn between his loyalty to his cause and his heart, Simon seeks answers about Sophie only to learn that everything he thought he knew about his involvement in both wars is based on a lie.

What's great about this novel is a discussion guide at the end. Perhaps it would make a great monthly book discussion group choice. It's a 2022 release and you will find it in the new book section of our library.
