News from the Park Administrator

The weather, in my opinion, has been wonderful! The nights have dropped into the mid-60s and the daytime highs are in the mid-80s. I've heard this is better than the temps you all are experiencing up north. This is my invitation to you to get to the Park pronto! Oh, and the humidity is much lower.

When you arrive from your summer away, be sure to visit the goats. The two new ones are fun to watch, but they have not yet learned to come to the fence for food. They are quite happy eating the weeds and leaves in their pasture. Except when they believe the "grass to be greener" on the other side of the fence. When that happens, they get stuck with their head through the fence, and someone has to rescue them. It could be you!

I have heard from several people how nice the roadways are after having been repaved. As noted last month, however, the manhole covers that were scheduled to be raised have not been completed. Fortunately, I just received notification that most of them will be completed by the end of October. Smoother rides are ahead!

Water lovers, be sure to get in the pool when you return. It is in wonderful shape. We are adjusting the equipment to deal with the cooler weather, so the pool should be warmer than the surrounding air. The pool looks great, and the water is clear; so, jump in!

We are planning to have a Thanksgiving meal. COVID precautions will be in place to minimize the risk of infections. The limited seating arrangement currently in place will remain. Food will not be placed on tables to be passed from person to person. Instead, food will be placed on tables to be dished out by each diner who will be required to put on gloves at the front of the line. Hood Hall fans will be set to provide continuous airflow throughout the meal. If you have other precautions, please let me know.

Even though there are signs in the trash area that give guidance on what goes where and provides some instructions on how to prepare things, there are still problems. Please flatten all cardboard boxes before placing them in the recycle bin. I do not like crawling into the bin to flatten them for you. Also, if you are discarding a box made of corrugated

cardboard, it does not belong in the regular trash. Please take the time to break it down (flatten it) and place it in the recycle bin.

Recently, we have had several reports and/or questions from residents about registrations for their vehicle or trailer/mobile home coming from Polk County. The most recent was from an owner of a double-wide who received two registrations. That was expected. What wasn't expected was having each come from a different county. Yes, that's right. One registration was from Polk County and one was from Hillsborough County even though the title was registered in one location. I tell this story to ask for your help. If you receive registrations from Polk County, please provide the office with a copy or bring it to the office so we can copy it. That information might be useful in the future.

As of this writing we have received four quotes for cutting down the large tree on Shiloh Path and are waiting for one more. I will be awarding the contract early next week. So, it is likely that the behemoth will be gone when you return. I hate to see trees cut down without a plan to replace them. So, I have spoken with the folks at K & K Nursery who have provided me with suggestions about tree varieties to consider. Some of the questions remaining are where will we plant trees and which varieties will we choose? Your suggestions are welcome!

On a similar note, the Board has approved the replacement of the shrubs that line the outside of the gate area. To control the costs of the project, we plan to do the removal of the old shrubs and planting of the new ones ourselves. I would like to complete it, if possible, before the beginning of the year, but will need commitments from volunteers to help before I order the shrubs. Please contact the office if you are willing to assist.

Although we have not had any hurricanes in our area, the season is not over. If there is the threat of a hurricane, watch your email and text messages for information from the Park.

Great weather. Fun goats. Smooth roads. Great swimming. Delicious Thanksgiving meal. Lasting friendships. Doesn't it just make you want to get to the Park right away? See you soon.

Office Manager

Actually, we have been very busy in the office. The confirmations for rentals went out this week. The directory is being proofed. Properties have been selling and it looked like we would not have much available. Then, as usual, some more went up for sale. We are always in transition here.

Speaking of selling places. We have always had the Park Administrator do pre-sale inspections when a property went up for sale. In the last 2 years, we have developed a form for the Administrator to fill out. This gives him a chance to look at the same things in each place and highlight any observations that may be good or of concern. We have used it now for a year or so and it seems like it is about where we want it. There may be a few more tweaks, but we have now decided to make it available to both the seller and the buyer when a home deal is being made. If we forget to give it to you, please feel free to remind us.

Some things have changed in the Laundromat. The rates have been increased. We were really much lower than most places and it will help us get more to offset the cost of providing this service. Another thing that we have coming in the laundry area is changing the machines to take credit cards or an app on the phone. Most places are moving toward this because of the shortage of coins. This will eliminate the need for coins which have been very hard to get. When we have this in place, more information will become available.

As usual, in November, I begin planning for winter season events. Last year was quite different and most events didn't happen so I am getting back in the groove. If you are planning an event (alumni, reunion or whatever), please let me know your napkins, placemats, etc. needs. I am working on Mugs on Monday supplies because we all want to be ready for that.

We are getting the directories ready to print. All we need to do is proof. Luckily, we have a new

These Nameless Things

by Shawn Smucker

Here's a thought-provoking Christian Novel filled with suspense, past forgotten memories which tie together with present issues. This is a page turner, again with many unsuspecting turns. How far would YOU go to assuage your own guilt? What are your limits to doing things for someone YOU love?

Before Dan opened his door to find a wounded woman who had escaped from the tormentors in the mountain, his life had become rather quiet. He and the eight other people in the mostly abandoned town had become friends. They spent peaceful evenings around the campfire and even made vague plans to journey east one day and leave the ominous mountain behind.

The woman's arrival changes everything. Who is she? How does she know so much about Dan's brother, who is still held captive in the mountain? Why are long-forgotten memories rising to the surface? And why does Dan feel so compelled to keep her presence in his house a secret? How can one live for years with the other 8 people of the village and not realize they all have a special link?

This book offers to remind you of all the nameless things you have forgotten. Let it hold you in its promises of redemption. This is a book to ponder about because it tells a rich truth story of waiting for something to happen, that could have happened long ago. A rich journey. A quiet return. Compare it to allegory meets fairytale meets post-apocalyptic hope.

I encourage you to read this book. Although it seems scary, the message it gives is one we all need to learn. It also will be found on the New Book shelves or on the counter. Let me know how you like it!

Most of us have watched Good Morning America with co-anchor, Robin Roberts. She is knowledgeable, well-educated, nice looking. Along with those qualities she was privileged to have an outstanding mother who taught her about life.

Her mother, Lucimarian Roberts, envelops resilience, faith and generations of joy. The book reflects on a life buoyed by her deep love of music, as well as her commitment to her faith and civic service. The same musicality that steadied her as a young woman growing up in the segregated South, then marrying her husband of 53 years (who was a Tuskegee Airman). Excerpts of biblical passages and lyrics from her favorite spirituals add a devotional quality to the main narrative that is both endearing and uplifting.

Diane Sawyer, Emmy Award-winning journalist states, "This book is a beam of light, just like the author herself. So much hope and healing and a song to lift up every heart. In these pages, the wonderful Robin Roberts and her mother have a conversation that will make every mother and daughter smile."

Lucimarian Tolliver was born in 1924 in Akron, Ohio. As a teenager she was awarded the John S. Knight Scholarship, given by the publishers of the Akron Beacon Journal. The first person in her family to go to college, Tolliver graduated in 1946 from Howard University, where she met her future husband, Lawrence Roberts. The couple had four children and moved 27 times as part of Mr. Roberts' career as an Air Force officer. That in itself is truly amazing.

Mrs. Roberts uses her family's oral history, faith, intervention by teachers and ministers and photographs to overcome discrimination, poor economic conditions, to achieve her dream of attending college and graduating with a degree in social work.

This book is truly an inspiration and includes her favorite songs she sang, and Bible verses she relied on to get her through the tough patches. Robin Robert's voice was heard as she added more details and her thoughts about her mother's reminiscences.

If you choose to read this, you will not be disappointed! It may even cause you to reflect how family, resiliency and faith affects in your own life. Look for this book in the New Book Section and later in the Biography section which is close to the back door.
