News from the Park Administrator

Celebrations! We love them. We celebrate birthdays, anniversaries, and annual holidays. This February, Gloria and I are celebrating our 3rd Park anniversary (is there a special name for that?). It is hard to believe that three years have passed already; and it is an anniversary worth celebrating! I love working here. We love being a part of the activities and enjoy getting to know you all. Thank you for allowing us this opportunity.

Volunteers continue to make huge improvements in our Park! Work on the sidewalk between the library and the pool is progressing well. Once the curbs on the bridge finish curing, concrete will be poured to form the bridge deck and the sidewalk. Digging began in late January to start relocating the 2" water main running under some of the Ebenezer residences. This will enable us to repair water line breaks in that area much more easily.

Plans are underway to rebuild the stormwater flow from the Park into the Jordan as the river leaves the Park. However, we need to move some electrical services before we will be able to proceed and we have to coordinate with TECO before we can move forward. This is a continuation of the goal of improving the entire stormwater infrastructure in the Park.

The truck we purchased recently has already been put to good use pulling the dump trailer. We have been hauling sand as well as brush and grass from the creek. As we mentioned at the members' meeting, we are accepting donations toward the purchase of the truck. We are also looking for donations that will allow us to purchase a skid steer to replace our old, worn-out Bobcat. Research shows that a used one will run somewhere around \$50,000. This is a piece of machinery we would use nearly every day to make improvements to our Park. We will provide a receipt acceptable for income tax purposes if you wish.

If you haven't noticed already, we have replaced some faded stop signs to make them more visible. I hope that this means you will see them better and know to stop.

We have also replaced some stop signs with yield signs. The purpose of the change was to encourage you to stop at the intersections at which you cannot see well and allow you to proceed with caution at those intersections where cross-traffic visibility is better. You will also note that there are pedestrian signs cautioning drivers of the possibility of foot traffic at the end of the sidewalk coming from the church on to Bethel Avenue. Keep in mind that we want to keep our walking/running/biking members and guests safe!

Group Activities' fund balances have been posted in Hood Hall. If you have questions about what was allocated to your group for this season, please contact me.

Just a couple of days ago, a fire broke out in one of the dumpsters. Do **NOT** throw anything that could ignite into the dumpster. If you have hot coals, be certain they are fully extinguished before putting them in the trash. To fully contain the fire, we had to dump the contents of the dumpster onto the ground.

I won't go into a long list of items that were discovered, but I do want to point out two. First, I saw several aluminum cans. Did you know that we recycle those, and the Park receives money for them? That money is set aside for special uses in the Park. So, please place your empty aluminum cans in the appropriate tub located in the white fenced in area. The second items I saw were several cannedgoods cans. There is also a tub in the white fenced in area for those. The gentleman who collects our metal recycles those. As I understand it, recycling metal is his livelihood. Let's honor him by giving him all our clean food cans.

The Park's digital directory (an app available on your phone) is becoming what we hoped it could be. More people are signing up to be included, and more photos have been added. I have heard from so many how useful the tool is. Right from the app, you can look up addresses, call, or text someone, while associating a face with a name! If you want to be included, but haven't signed up, or you need help getting started, please stop by the office.



Stamps for Missions

All donated stamps are sent to Alliance Stamp Ministry in Fort Myers where they are sold to dealers. The money is sent to a publisher in Buenos Aires, Argentina where they publish Sunday school material in Spanish that are sold to at least eight Latin American Countries as well as Spain and the US. They are used by over 40 Protestant Denominations.

Try to leave at least 1/4 inch or more around each stamp or strip of stamps. They now collect picture post cards both unused and used. If used, please leave the stamps on the cards. Thank you. The container is in **Hood Hall** for your convenience.
