#### **News from the Park Administrator**

Greetings, from Florida's Light and Life Park. Fall has arrived. The weather is gorgeous. It is cool at night and warm during the day. November has always been my favorite month to be in FL. The weather is mild and there aren't as many people as there will be in the winter.

Members are filtering back into the park. Some are here to make sure their place will be ready for the winter. Others are back to stay for the duration. It seems members are returning earlier every year.

The grounds maintenance crew has been working on the new property just outside of the park gate. They are clearing out some brush and removing piles of dirt mixed with trash. We are trying to make this a nice place to walk through and enjoy.

We have made some changes in 2025 when it comes to closings involving deeded property. We are using a title company to handle these closings. This is being done to protect both parties and the park. The title company will perform title and lien searches. As well as providing title insurance. There are costs associated with using a title company, but the park can't take on the liability of doing the closing and possibly missing a lien that may have been put on the property. All money will be paid to and disbursed from the title company.

The park calendar is filling up for the winter season. Please make sure you call the office and get your event put on the calendar.

Please make sure you check into the office when you return to the park. We are trying to make sure we have an accurate account of who is in the park.

If you haven't heard, Tina and I will be moving to KY in the next few months. Our home is for sale, and we have a buyer under contract. I plan to stay as the Park Administrator until the end of January. This will give the board time to find my replacement and time for me to train them. It has been a pleasure to serve the park. I will be back to visit and maybe one day to become a member of the park.

#### **Library Update**

It's been over a year since Hurricane Milton hit our Park. So much has happened since then to restore the damage. Our Library and its contents were put on hold while the major repairs were taking place in people's homes.

Over 1,000 books, some furniture, bookcases, and archives were ruined when over two feet of water entered through the doors during the flood. Mud and debris covered the floor. But, God was good and most books were saved. We have had many people who have worked to restore the damage and bring it into a usable place of enjoyment again.

Many thanks to Barry Bunting and the Board of Trustees from Light and Life Free Methodist Church. Barry has done much work in the library himself. His dedication is an encouragement. Thank you, Barry! Jayme Sinsmyr, who helped lead us in the disaster, is still guiding us with the library remodeling. She has been guiding the group of students from SEU who have been here twice this month to clean up the books and rooms and to assemble some new furniture. We are so grateful for their help!

We are also so appreciative of the Montgomery, Alabama Free Methodist Church work team who came and installed the floors, moving all those boxes of books between the two rooms while working so hard. What a blessing God has provided with those who have aided in making Life and Light Park livable again.

Mark Letterman and our own Greg Thomas has helped along with the Redecorating Committee which includes Ida Bunting, Sue Noble, Jill Smith and Ron Ford. They have done an outstanding job of choosing furniture and pictures, painting, along with arranging the materials within the library to make it user friendly and a place of enjoyment again. The colors chosen for the walls is soothing and the coffee bar which has been installed will make working in the library for all of us more enjoyable.

Changes though are inevitable. There will be far fewer books with around half of them being removed.

Our fiction will be reduced to classics, less romance, with fewer volumes and an increase in newer books. We will keep our favorite authors, but fewer volumes.

Our nonfiction had so many volumes that were not looked at in years. We are hoping to make that section more useful and noteworthy. Our Bible Study section will have a new look with copies of current Bible studies being offered and research. The biography and Free Methodist sections will also be revamped and much smaller. There will also be two computers available at convenient workstations, along with other areas for you to bring your own laptops for personal work. A printer will be available for your use with a fee for the ink and paper.

We want to have fewer magazines and ones that you have chosen as important. Birds and Blooms and a current Christian News magazine will be offered. Please give us ideas on which magazines you would like to see in the library.
