It is hard to believe that another winter season is drawing to a close. The season has been very busy with golf, cornhole, and shuffleboard tournaments. We have had wonderful concerts. Hurricane season is fast approaching once again. If you are leaving the Park for the season, it is imperative that you ensure that you have "wind-proofed" your residence. Here are some steps you need to take BEFORE you leave. If you are not able, please seek assistance from others in the Park.

- If possible, move everything that is outside your residence is moved to a secure indoor location.
- If there are items you cannot move indoors, ensure that those items cannot become wind-blown missiles. Are the items heavy enough to stay put, or do they need tied down?

For those remaining in the Park during the summer, we will be conducting a hurricane preparedness meeting sometime in the near future.

Through your volunteer efforts, improvements have been made in the Park making it look and function even better. Here are a few things that were accomplished this past season. The landscaping outside the gate has been upgraded and made more attractive. The bridge to the 30 acres is nearly complete. Additional stormwater infrastructure has been installed. Martha's Place received a facelift. The goat barn has a cement floor making it easier to clean. The flow of the stormwater ditch running south of the library has been improved and the area reseeded in preparation for a new sidewalk. Thank you one and all!



Book Reviews by Gloria Welton

A Lion Called Christian

By Anthony Burke and John Rendall

There is just something about animal stories, whether it is animal - human or animal – animal. The interaction is unique and the bond great. According to the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) the human- animal bond is defined as, "...a mutually beneficial and dynamic relationship between people and animals".

Because we love animals, we provide them with food, shelter, medical care, entertainment, and affection. The ways in which humans benefit, go deeper than basic needs: **stress reduction increased healing and independence, improved mood, more physical activity, immunity boosts and social connections. Pets also help with emotional support.**

A pet doesn't care how much money you make, what type of car you drive, what you look like, or whether you wear name-brand clothes. Pets provide us with impartial, unconditional emotional support and love.

In the late 1960s and early 70s, it was not unusual to see exotic animals in department stores. Not today. In *A Lion Called Christian 2* friends from Australia moved to England for a year. They went to Harrods, a luxury and expensive department store where they were intrigued by a lion cub.

Christian was a loyal and devoted pet who had an easy-going personality. The three of them bonded very closely. Think about this lion licking and snuggling up to grown humans! I don't want to give the book away. *A Lion Called Christian* is worth checking out of the library. A very easy read. Who knows, you might learn how humans and animals but need to be loved!

When God Disappears

By Shane Stafford

Have you ever felt as if God is nowhere around? A distant unreachable star millions of light years away? What about when we make the same mistakes over and over? When the chasm between what we do and what God intends seems so wide, we cannot even see the other side? This does happen over and over because we **are** human with a sinful nature.

Shane Stafford, the author of *When God Disappears*, writes about six different encounters written in the Gospel: Encounters with Zacchaeus, the Woman at the Well, the Man with a Demon-possessed Sin, and the Woman Caught in Adultery. Along with those encounters with Mary, Martha, and Lazarus and his 6th one with Peter. *When God Disappears*, he helps us to do the same: to see ourselves in these messy, all too-human Jesus encounters and to experience the grace and hope of a God who has not forgotten us.

Sanford's difficult health issues (Hemophilia, HIV through a blood transfusion, and Hepatitis C) have given him a beautiful outlook about God. He has experienced prejudice and rejection from Christians. He himself has experienced deep pain and betrayal. His humility is amazing. You have all heard about these encounters, but he gives a unique insight to what we have all experienced.

The book provides a Study and Reflection Guide for each encounter and is worth a read. You will find this book in nonfiction, 248, Christian Life on the middle shelves closest to the windows and directly across from the fiction against that wall. Let me know what you think.
