News from the Park Administrator

Light and Life Park is such a great place to live, work and play. I love that visitors report that they have had a great time and how good the Park looks. Thank you, members, renters, and visitors. Together, we make this the great place that it is.

The work of volunteers is evident everywhere! Let me take you on a short tour. As you pull up to the gate, you will see new landscaping enhancing the look of our entrance. Proceed to Beulah Land and take a look at Martha's Place. It has been given an exterior washing and painting as well as a new stoop, planters, and bushes. As you continue to the back of the Park, the replacement mower shed is well under construction and will be ready for use in the near future. Walk to the center of the Park and notice the work that has been completed so far on the ditch running behind the library. Although some of the work has been completed by our paid staff, many volunteers have contributed to this work in progress!

In addition, many hours of volunteer work has been completed on the golf course, shuffleboard courts, pool, miniature golf, and assisting in the setup of audio and video for meetings and events. And, speaking of events, I am reminded of the many hours that were spent by volunteers planning and executing the parade and the all-park field day. Yes, this Park is fueled by volunteers. Thank you every one!

And if you haven't volunteered yet, don't worry, There will be more volunteer opportunities over the next few weeks. Watch your email for details.

In the past, Sugar Creek Gang has played a significant role in many projects in the Park. We are in the process of reorganizing the way the group is managed and how it is organized. There is a large number of people who have been part of this group in the past and I have invited others to be involved. Recently, I sent out an invitation for group members to help with a project and have had several responses. Please be patient with us as we reorganize.

If you are wondering how much money your group has in their account, please check the bulletin board in Hood Hall. I am attempting to update the sheet monthly to keep you posted. However, since the number will change during the month, just ask me if you need to know the current amount.

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As most of you have probably heard, there was a major fire and explosion behind the Villas just outside our Park. Fortunately, no one was injured. And, because of the quick thinking of several Villa residents who sprayed water on the roof of the Villa's storage shed, there was no significant damage to our property. There was, however, some minor damage to the privacy fence between us and the neighbors, and there has already been discussions about repairing that.

For the past year or more, the Board and Member meetings have been broadcast on Zoom. Setting up and tearing down required a great deal of my time and the assistance of several volunteers. This year, I have been able to get much of the wiring and equipment in place on a semi-permanent basis. It is important that you check with me before removing or relocating any wires or equipment. If you need to move something, please check with me first.

Zoom has made it possible for people to view and participate in meetings who are unable to attend either because they are not at the Park or they have physical limitations. Online access to meetings is an ongoing reality that is a positive outcome of the COVID restrictions we experienced early in the pandemic. If you want to Zoom in and have any problems or questions about joining a Zoom meeting, please let me know by email.

The Digital Park Directory has grown quite a bit over the last few weeks. Many more people have signed up, and we are working hard to get people added. You can use the Directory to find the Park address of someone you're looking for as you drive around right from your phone. Also, if a person is listed, you can call, text or email them right from your device. That can only be done if everyone is listed in the Directory. If you are not yet listed in the Directory, please call the office and we can get you started. Once you have been added, you will need to install the *Instant Church Directory* onto your phone and then set up an account. If you need help doing any of that, please check with a neighbor or call the office.

I have heard from several people this year that they see so many new people they don't know. So, here's a challenge for you. Make an effort to get to know someone new. Break up your cliques—at least for an afternoon or evening. Invite someone you don't know to be a part of what you do. Get to know them. Spend time with them. You never know what friendship might develop. As we get to know more of about one another, the Park will become an even more special place.

Many times it looks as if no one uses the library; however it is amazing to see the busyness. That is what I have observed these past few weeks and that is *EXCITING!*

Les has been making changes that will inspire you to come and see. Those changes include:

- Continuously updating our library with current or popular books
- Taking recommendations and requests for particular books, authors, series, or magazines
- Cataloging all talking books - fiction and nonfiction
- Updating westerns – looking for new Christian authors and replacements of old books
- Labeling shelves for finding what you want
- Categorizing by genre what type of fiction – Westerns, Amish, Suspense, Family, Humor. This will be at the top of the book spine
- Preparing to put a computer for ease in looking up books

Here are some important reminders from the Administrator:

1. Any plans to make structural changes or additions to your residence or add a shed or concrete to your property must receive Administrator approval prior to beginning the project. Please use the form available in the office to submit your request well in advance of your timeline for doing the work.
2. If you or your group are planning an event or wish to use Hood Hall or Maxwell Commons, please check with the office first to ensure there are no scheduling conflicts. Your event or reservation will be added to the Park calendar once a time is confirmed.
3. Please follow posted speed limits and stop signs. I have seen some close calls between cars and bicyclists. Safety is much more important than the few seconds that might be saved by not stopping at a stop sign or speeding through the Park.
4. Although we love the wildlife in the Park, it is important to remember that it is illegal and often dangerous to feed them. If you feed alligators, they will begin to view us as food delivery people. Once that happens, they may attack if someone approaches that does not have food. Do NOT feed the alligators. It is also important to note that if you tease alligators, they may become aggressive. We can live in harmony if we leave them alone.
5. Unfortunately, we do not have a way to recycle plastics. The ONLY recycling we do is corrugated cardboard, metals, and aluminum cans. Corrugated cardboard should be clean (no greasy pizza boxes), broken down, and placed in the cardboard recycling bin. Aluminum and metal food containers should be placed in the marked barrels in the metal recycling area. (Please read Wes Crist's article on cans.) Other metals can be placed in that area. Plastics must be put in the regular trash bins with general household waste. Please crush plastic bottles and containers as flat as possible.
6. If you have debris from remodeling or have large furniture to discard, please place it in or next to the construction dumpster. But remember, the construction dumpster is a service the Park provides that is NOT included in Park fees. Please make a donation to help defray the cost of this service.
